### CONCORD TOWNSHIP HISTORICAL SOCIETY ANNOUNCES: Virginia Merion DeNenno History and Education Center

The long time headquarters of Concord Township Historical Society (CTHS) has been renamed The Virginia Merion DeNenno History and Education Center, at Pierce-Willits House. The Society's Board voted the change at its February 2009 meeting.

CTHS has amassed a large collection of artifacts and papers encompassing the over 300-year history of Concord Township. This collection includes early photographs, deeds and other papers, farm implements utilized in our township's early history, and many other objects. The Society's Collections Committee has begun to catalog these objects, photographs, archival material, and books so that they can be properly shared with our community and the public at large. These items will be featured on its new website and used in its updated educational program for eighth graders.

CTHS artifacts and paper-based collections are due directly to the efforts of Virginia "Ginny" DeNenno, who has solicited, accepted, and sought out important icons of our early history for decades. Ginny has been involved in CTHS since its inception in 1967, playing an instrumental role throughout its existence, and holding the position of President for many years. On a personal note, Ginny has lived in our township most of her life, is a member of Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR), and her family presence in our township goes back more than 100 years. She has been a member of the Concord Township Planning Commission since 1979 and is recognized as a central figure of township development, both from a planning as well as an historical perspective. She was responsible for two books on Concord history and initiated the educational program now being updated with the middle school.

Thus it is appropriate to honor the many years of Ginny's dedication to the preservation of our local history and to pay her tribute by the renaming of the Society's headquarters. Mary Wiechecki, of Garnet Mine Road, her long-time friend and fellow officer of the Society, said "It's wonderful that Ginny's name will be remembered in the Township for years to come. Her dedication to Concord, and to its history, is unmatched, and has made a lot of difference in the quality of life here."

CTHS exists to stimulate interest in this historic township and its colorful heritage, and to encourage participation in the restoration and preservation of its historic landmarks. The Pierce-Willits House is located at 659 Smithbridge Road in Concord Township and is open to the public during Township and Society-hosted events, and by appointment. # Important Information

## Concord Township Residents

**Solicitors** are allowed to canvass Concord Township only after obtaining a Concord Township permit. The person at your door should be able to produce a current 2" 1/2" x 4" yellow laminated card with his/her picture, signed by Township Manager Robert J. Willert.

The Township issues permits only to those individuals who meet the requirements of Chapter 176, Transient Retail Merchants of the Township Code, who have completed a Township application, and who have passed a Pennsylvania State Police background check. **Do not open your door to anyone who makes you uncomfortable. Call the State Police if you notice anyone suspicious in your neighborhood.**

## A MESSAGE FROM THE CONCORD TOWNSHIP SEWER AUTHORITY

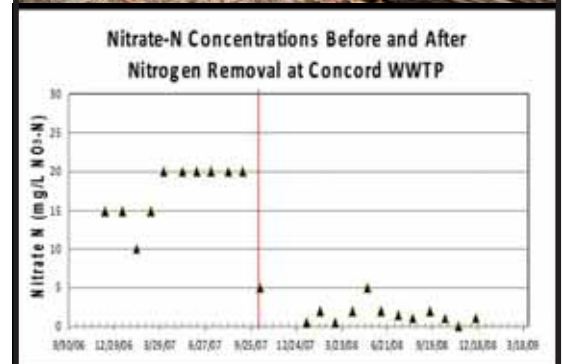
Each customer connected to the public sewer in Concord Township can help to maintain and/or reduce the costs for processing wastewater by doing the following:

- Maintain lawn cleanouts by keeping them at least 6" above ground surface and the screw cap intact to prevent unwanted ground water infiltration and objects from entering your piping
- Use phosphate-free dishwashing detergent – it's good for the environment too
- Use your garbage disposal unit sparingly – large food matter, peelings, etc. should be placed in the trash or composted
- **NEVER** dump paint, solvent, oil, fuel, chemicals, coffee grounds, grease, feminine hygiene products or pool water into the wastewater/sewer system.

## INVESTMENT IN TECHNOLOGY PAYS OFF FOR CONCORD TOWNSHIP SEWER AUTHORITY AND THE WEST BRANCH OF CHESTER CREEK

In October 2007, the Concord Township Sewer Authority went on line with a state of the art, \$7 million upgrade designed to process 1.8 million gallons of wastewater per day (GPD) prior to discharging into the West Branch of Chester Creek. The plant is currently processing about 900,000 GPD from 2,200 residences and 100 commercial establishments in Concord, Chester Heights, and western Thornbury Township, Delaware County. The current process uses on/off aeration to achieve optimal conditions for nutrient reductions. The process technology has significantly reduced the levels of nitrogen and phosphorus in the wastewater discharge to the West Branch. These two elements, if left unchecked, contribute to the growth of algae in what is an already stressed environmental condition of Chester Creek.

In addition to the excellent results achieved with nutrient reductions and reduced use of chemicals, the Authority has managed to cut the volume of its residential waste hauled to landfills with sludge thickening, which has reduced sludge disposal costs by \$100,000 per year. All of these improved environmental impacts and reduced material costs have been achieved with only a nominal increase in electric demand, through the investment in "smart" process controls.

# CONCORD Progress



Construction continues on the new municipal complex on approximately 23 township-owned acres at 43 Thornton Road. Pictured above is the new public meeting room addition (~2,700 square foot), as well as the main entrance and elevator shaft to the second and third floors. Concord Township municipal offices will occupy the first floor of the former Dante orphanage; the second and third floors will be offered for lease.

This property abuts an earlier open space purchase of approximately 42 acres, known as the Fisher tract. Two acres are being leased to the Brandywine Youth Club (BYC); construction of the BYC gymnasium is complete. Future improvements to the complex include a walking trail, a multipurpose play/ball field, along with lighting and additional parking.

It is anticipated that all township departments – Administration, Codes, Zoning, Planning, Engineering, and Accounting – will move into the renovated facility in September of this year. The real estate Tax Office will be relocated to the new facility also. Public Works will remain in its present location on Smithbridge Road.



Additionally, the former Maplewood gymnasium located on the same property has become the Concord Community Center. The Board of Supervisors has obtained a Community Development Block Grant in the amount of \$100,000 which has enabled the township to proceed with replacing the roof and removing the portico in order to restore the original look of the building.

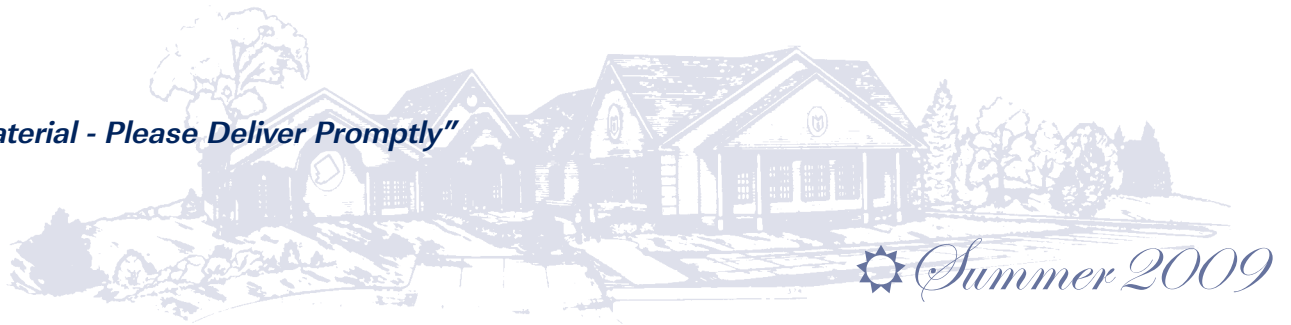
